

### 2nd February 2018 Andrey Lebedev


Born in Moscow and raised in Australia, Andrey Lebedev is one of the most successful upcoming guitarists of his generation. During his studies he worked with Julian Bream

They were formed in 2004 and named after the great Scottish violist, William Primrose. Of a recent performance of Brahms' A Major Quartet, to be performed this evening, a reviewer wrote, *'The performance was fantastic in every respect...their concept of sound was convincingly Brahmsian.
